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SAUVIGNON BLANC

This versatile, assertively flavoured, and often affordable white grape variety originated in France, but it took New Zealand applying the latest vine-growing techniques to bring in it global popularity.

Sauvignon Blanc is an aromatic grape variety, with sometimes aggressive flavours and vibrant acidity. It offers diverse fruit and herbal note, depending on where and how it is grown. From the coolest parts of New Zealand it gives grassy aromas and tangy grapefruit flavours. From slightly warmer areas in California and Chile it can be herbal, or more complex and riper with melon nuances.



BARREL-AGED

A style made famous by Robert Mondavi in the 1970s when he renamed his barrel-aged Sauvignon Blanc Fumé Blanc. Barrel-aged Sauvignon Blanc tastes creamy while still exhibiting the variety's trademark "green" notes.

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RED WINE

PINOT NOIR

The Côte de Nuits of the Burgundy region has over many centuries bred legendary wines from such famous parcels as Clos de Vougeot, Romanée-Conti, La Tache, Chambertin, and Le Musigny. Here, as in most of France, the wines are named for their vineyard districts rather than the grape variety from which they were made, but behind all the great names is one red grape variety – Pinot Noir.

The Côte de Nuits, and its sibling the Côte de Beaune just to the south, long ago set the standard for Pinot Noir wines: medium to full bodied, smooth-textured red wines that are not as “noir” as their name suggests.

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BORDEAUX BLEND

Vineyard in Bordeaux grow different red grape varieties: Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, Cabernet Franc, Petite Verdot, Malbec, Caménère & others. Merlot and Cabernet Sauvignon originated in Bordeaux and are blended into the eponymous Bordeaux Blend. Red wine makes up nearly 90% of the production.

Blends dominated by Cabernet Sauvignon typically have gripper tannin and green peppercorn notes, whereas Merlot blends have smoother tannins and more red fruit notes.

REGIONAL DIFFERENCES:

When comparing Bordeaux blends from different regions, you'll notice some taste differences:



Expected ripe black fruit with undertones of menthol, chocolate and allspice. Wine may be bolder with riper-tasting tannin.

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TEMPRANILLO

Spain's most celebrated red grape variety is the main component in the wines of Rioja and Ribera del Duero, although you rarely see its name on the labels. Tempranillo can take young, Fruity, affordable wines or deep, rich, and long ageing estate-bottled reds. It is Spain's most widely planted variety.

It tends to give medium- to full-bodied wines with rather similar fruit flavours to the Bordeaux varieties of Cabernet Sauvignon and Merlot, but with more-dusky, herbal, and leather aromas. Tempranillo's flavours marry beautifully with the effect of ageing in oak barrels.

REGIONAL WINES:

Tempranillo is Spain's top red wine. It's typically labelled by its regional name, Example: La Rioja, Castilla y León, La Mancha, Extremadura, & etc.



AGING TERMS: Spanish wines can be identified by ageing terms. Rules vary from region to region.

- **Roble/Tinto:** Little to no oak ageing
- **Crianza:** 6-12 months ageing in oak
- **Reserva:** 12 months oak ageing with up to 2 years of bottle ageing
- **Gran Reserva:** 18-24 months oak ageing with up to 4 years of bottle ageing.



COMMON STYLES

- **Young (Roble/Crianza):**
 - Juicy red fruit flavours, herbs and spick kick
- **Some Ageing (Reserva):**
 - Red and black fruit flavours, dried roses and baking spices.
- **Long Ageing (Reserva+):**
 - Dried red and black fruits, fig, cinnamon, and cedar flavours with notes of leather and dusty dry leaves.

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SANGIOVESE

Sangiovese is one of those grape variety that prefers to stay at home. While it has made delicious, tangy red wines in Tuscany for hundreds of years, and has adapted well to different location within Italy, few of the attempts to grow it elsewhere have resulted in memorable wines. This has not been the case with French varieties such as Merlot, Syrah, and Cabernet Sauvignon.

Tuscany is home base for Sangiovese. Some winemakers there craft it as light, simple, fruity wine for gulping rather than savouring, while others turn it into medium- and full-bodied fine wines that earn high marks from critics and age well.

Common Style:

- **Rustic Tomato & Leather:**
Traditional Production maintains Sangiovese's herbaceous flavours and high acidity by ageing wines in well-used barrels that do not impart vanilla-like flavour.
- **Modern Cherry & Clove:**
The modern style of Sangiovese wines employs oak ageing to produce sweet vanilla-like flavours and also smoother acidity.

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MALBEC

Malbec originated in South West France around Cahors but was never considered an important wine until Argentina revived the variety. Today, Argentina produces over 75% of the world's Malbec wines.

The majority of Malbec in Argentina comes from around Mendoza, with the best wines coming primarily from the high-elevation subregions of Uco Valley and Lujan de Cuyo.

In Argentina, altitude is a key quality indicator for Malbec. Higher-elevation Malbec will have higher acidity, more tannin and additional flower and herb notes.

In France, Malbec is mostly from Cahors in the South West region. The wine, with a more earthy profile, is very different from Argentine Malbec. Expect higher tannin and flavours of red- and blackcurrant, smoke and liquorice.



Common Style:

- **Basic Malbec:**
A juicy style of Malbec with dominant red fruit flavours and balanced tannin, made with little to no oak ageing.
- **Reserva Malbec:**
Higher-end Malbec wines tend to age in oak longer and offer black fruit, chocolate, sweet tobacco and subtle notes of wild iris.

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SYRAH / SHIRAZ

Shiraz brought Australia wine onto the international stage in the late 20th century, and it continues to inspire some of the greatest winemaking efforts in that country. Australian Shiraz is usually made in different style than French Syrah (which is the identical grape variety under a different name), with riper fruit flavours, a thicker texture, and a greater impression of sweetness.

At lower price level Shiraz can be plump, pleasantly viscous, jammy, and sweet. High level of Shiraz is more complex, with blueberry and violet aromas, a touch of anise, and mouth-filling richness. Big and bold, then, but not rough.

REGIONAL DIFFERENCES:

When comparing Syrah wines from different regions, you will notice some taste differences:

Full-bodied wines with fruit-forward flavours of blackberry, blueberry, sweet tobacco smoke, chocolate, baking spices and vanilla.
